

HELLO FROM THE CHAIR

I wish you could have been with me recently for a 45-minute walk through an impressive shopping mall in Accra, Ghana, where I was leading our four-day board retreat. You would have of course recognized the world-famous brands on sale: Apple and Skechers, Sony and Chanel, even KFC and Burger King. The displays were top-notch, the wide aisles clean and brightly lit. For a moment you could have thought you were in Minneapolis or Phoenix or Birmingham, not West Africa.

And how were the customers paying for their selections? Very few used cash or even credit cards; most simply pulled out their phones. A few taps on the screen, and they were on their way to the next shop. In Ghana it's called MoMoPay (mobile-money-pay—get it?). The international news magazine The Economist reported in its September 3, 2022, issue, "A third of adults in sub-Saharan Africa now have a mobile-money account, up from a fifth in 2017."

Obviously, Africans who shop at a stylish mall—the rising middle class—can afford to buy a Bible, too. (Which is a good thing, because the hard reality is that there's no such thing as a free Bible. Paper mills have to be paid; so do printers and shipping companies. For a Bible or New Testament to get to the end user, somebody has to come up with the necessary dollars/euros/shillings etc.—if not the eager reader, then a friend or donor somewhere.)

Thus at Oasis, we provide God's Word (as well as Christian books) in two ways: We sell copies to those who can pay, and we give already-funded copies to those who cannot. Less than 48 hours after my visit to the shopping mall, I stood in the open air of a schoolyard handing out durable Bibles with a colorful cover (see photo) to entire junior-high and senior-high student bodies. Their parents could barely afford to cover tuition fees and the required uniforms, let alone provide a Bible for their child's R.E. (religious education) course. Yes, in many African nations that's a fourth "R" in the curriculum, alongside reading, 'riting, and 'rithmetic. Oasis is a prime source for these young minds.

Thank you for the important part you play in making this "supply chain" work for the advancement of God's kingdom across Africa. It is, after all, the second largest continent (in both land area and population) on the planet.





Empowering African Voices Programme

God's Word for Africa

Thousands of pastors in Africa are leading churches with little or no training. They have few resources to help them understand and correctly apply God's Word. God's Word for Africa equips pastors, leaders, and students in Africa, who have a demonstrated need but limited means with Africa Study Bibles or other biblical resources. As often as possible, the recipients of the Africa Study Bible receive training on how to most effectively utilize the various features of this unique resource, in their teaching and ministries.

School Bibles Programme

The School Bibles Programme enables our partners to place an easily understandable Bible in the hands of youth and children in schools. In most cases, students are in a Bible class or after-school programs where they are being discipled.



Cedric Kanana with Benjamin Fischer -Authors of I Once Was Dead

Cedric Kanana's drug use, and later drug trafficking, arose after his home broke in the wake of the genocide and he ended up living on the streets.

In his book, *I Once Was Dead*, co-authored by Rev Benjamin Fischer, Rev Cedric Kanana's story explores one central message. Jesus is stronger than death, than addiction, than Islam, than traditional religion, than curses.

God's deliverance is the center of his compelling testimony. The miracles recorded in *I Once Was Dead* echo the book of Acts and give all glory to God – whether healing, deliverance, resurrection, protection from threats, or hearing God's voice.

Rev Kanana, a joyful evangelist and priest in the Anglican Church of Rwanda, includes practical explanations of his struggles. He faced tribal tensions, colonial prejudice, and threats as a Muslim background believer.


Rev Kanana is chaplain at Kigali prison and director of the Father's Union. For the last ten years, Rev Kanana has preached at university missions and evangelistic conferences throughout East Africa. He is currently working on a PhD from South African Theological Seminary.

The co-author, Rev Fischer, is the rector of Christ the Redeemer in Nampa, Idaho, and Associate Professor of Literature at Northwest Nazarene University.














LA BIBLE D'ÉTUDE: PERSPECTIVES AFRICAINES

Responding to the need for Frenchlanguage Bible study materials.

The enthusiastic response to the *Africa Study Bible* in English confirms its importance, but the lack of biblical resources in the French language makes the need for the French version even greater.


Partnering with PJA (Publications pour la jeunesse africaines), the creation of *La Bible d'étude: perspectives africaines* or *La BEPA* – a vital resource for Francophone Africa – was completed this year. With 161 maps and graphical features, 121 page topical index, and 2,253 total pages, *La BEPA* is a precious resource that we hope, over time, will reach the over 100 million Christians in Africa who read in French.

La BEPA Launch and Training Team members, Prof Dr Abel Ndjerarreou, BEPA Founding Member; Dr Augustin Ahoga, Launch and Training Coordinator French-speaking Africa; Geneviève Guei, Launch and Training Coordinator West French-speaking Africa; Barka Kamnadj, Launch and Training Coordinator Central and Islands French-speaking Africa, have held a series of pastor training events in various countries including Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Côte d'Ivoire, Burkina Faso, Benin, and Togo.

With the support of donors, Christian organizations, denominations, and churches, the first 15,000 copies of *La BEPA* have been shipped to nine countries, providing income to be used to pay for the second print by the end of 2022.

"French-speaking Africa is known for its material poverty. One element of this poverty is the lack of Christian literature resources in the French language. The need for French-language Bible study materials is, and remains to be, an even more profound source of poverty for the region. It will be like providing food (God's Word) for a starving population."


